Behavioral Health Care at CMHC, Inc. includes comprehensive diagnostic assessment of psychological and physical systems, medication management, psychotherapy and family therapy and education, and linkage with primary care providers.

Substance Abuse Care at CMHC, Inc. includes the provision of a state approved CSTAR Program with comprehensive assessment, group and individual treatment, family treatment, medication management, and collaboration with self-help groups and community resources.

Temporary Indigent Housing at CMHC, Inc. includes up to 2 weeks of emergency housing for individuals needing intensive day treatment stabilization and monitoring and up to 3 months of alternative housing for approved individuals and families who qualify.

Transportation Services at CMHC, Inc. include a van fleet that is available for patients and families in our day treatment and intensive outpatient behavioral health programs.

Our clinical staff has physicians, nurse practitioners, psychologists, professional counselors, nurses, substance abuse counselors, social workers, and case managers. Our programs include Day Treatment for Substance Abusers certified by the MO Department of Mental Health, transportation services, case management and patient monitoring and linkage, medication management, outpatient programs for families with serious and persistent mental illness, child and adolescent programs, neuropsychological assessment and rehabilitation of cognitive deficits, offender and Drug Court programs, emergency behavioral health services 24 hours a day 7 days a week, school psychology programs, and primary medical care programs. Our professionals are on staff at contiguous hospitals and provide psychiatric hospital treatment and assessment.

Our forensic programs include child custody evaluations, pre-sentence assessments, child abuse and neglect assessments, marital dissolution assessments, diversion program assessments, monitoring and case management of federal and state offenders, substance abuse traffic offender programs (SATOP, DRI, WIP, CIP, OEP), and Drug Court Diversion Programs.

We operate out of multi-sites with our main center in Nevada MO and clinics in Harrisonville and Lockwood MO, and programming in Barton County MO. Primary care appointments are available 6 days per week, and behavioral health appointments are available 6 days per week and evening appointments are available. Our transportation services traverse a 5 county area in western MO.

CMHC, Inc. is a HRSA approved site for federal manpower shortage area student loan forgiveness programs. Our training programs for psychologists, LPCs, PLCSWs, Certified Substance Abuse Counselors, nurse practitioners, and specialty administrative personnel have graduate over 15 doctors and 30 mid level providers over the last 10 years.

Research at CMHC, Inc. is another of our productive areas. Publications in national scientific and professional journals, books, and conferences are regular activities at our company. We have contributed to the literature and research in psychological diagnostics and testing, hospital assessment and linkage, neuropsychology, substance abuse, ethics and professional standards, forensic behavioral health, and other important areas. Currently, we are participating in research to restandardize and upgrade some of the most important diagnostic instruments in the mental health field.

Transportation Services include a fleet of vans that cover a broad area of 5 counties and allow individuals participating in our day treatment programs and extended service and intensive outpatient programs to access our centers even when they are without adequate transportation or capacity to transport themselves.

Housing programs provide an alternative to hospitalization for intensive outpatient program recipients or day treatment patients needing stabilization and transition back to the home or to adequate housing. For substance abuse program patients and individuals meeting certain poverty guidelines there is financial support for this program.

Twenty-four hour emergency services program. This program includes a 24 hour oncall service during which a patient and their family can reach the on-call licensed and/or certified clinical staff member who will make a telephone determination, see the patient for emergency assessment, or refer and link the patient to hospital or other clinically indicated services during crisis.

Director's Comments

CMHC, Inc. has served the Missouri and Kansas public for 29 years. We have provided the best psychologists, physicians, nurses, professional counselors and social workers, substance abuse counselors with leadership positions in their disciplines and their state associations. Recently, we have moved to implementation of scientifically proven and manualized treatments for substance abuse disorders and for specific diagnostic categories such as mood, sleep, and anxiety disorders.

Our staff have cared for families, provided specialty staffing for local hospitals and facilities, have served in justice system programs, and have done all this while paying taxes and refusing to use the umbrella of not-for-profit corporate configurations to avoid paying our fair share to maintain public works and facilities. We have stood for positive institutions such as schools, churches, sports programs, and civic clubs and groups. We have stood against controversial dynamics such as seeing drugs as a solution for psychological problems, failure of the system to integrate physical and behavioral health programs effectively, abandonment of the poor an

needy, the failure to have adequate mental health services in the schools, and against unethical practices such as taking children out for a coke or ice cream cone and calling it therapy, offering therapists without proper credentials or supervision, and adherence to out-moded and unscientific models which are based more on protection of discipline specific turf rather than getting the most effective and most accessible treatments for patients.

For 29 years we have stood firm as advocates for patients and the science which can be brought to bear on the behavioral health problems of patients. We have avoided the easy money of medication only and short-term therapy with little real diagnostics approaches and treated those in poverty, lack of health care coverage, and lack of access to mental health specialists. In doing so, we have believed in human potential and the capacity to change. We have made less money and met much resistance, and were often surprised when the greatest resistance to helping people came for those agencies chartered to assist them, but we are proud of the history of advocacy of CMHC, Inc.
